



1. Newton Arts Building

The personal collections of one wealthy Milan family are on display in this building. Take a step back in time when families traveled through Europe in search of antique treasures.

2. Galpin House

Named after the doctor presiding at Thomas Edison's birth, the house showcases a renowned glass collection, Milan history and the temporary exhibit room.

3. Doll & Toy House

See more than 400 antique dolls with examples of china, bisque, papier-mache and wax. A delightful toy room allows children to experience the toys of the past.

4. Sayles House

A fully furnished home, representative of the boom era in Milan's history. Of special interest are a weaving room, a child's bedroom and an up-ground cellar.

5. Gardener's Shed

Not open to the public.

6. Carriage Shed & Blacksmith Shop

Buggies, fire equipment, tools and farm machinery are reminiscent of the days before steam and gas-powered engines. Do not miss the restored Hoover Potato Digger!

7. General Store

A replica of the typical 1800s town market where prescriptions could be filled, calico and lace purchased and exotic coffee beans, brought in by schooner, were ground.

8. Gift Shop & Restrooms

The Museum Gift Shop features antique wooden toys, handmade glass, nautical gifts and Milan memorabilia. Public restroom facilities are located here.

9. Museum Office

The 1841 home serves as the Museum Office and is not open to the public as part of the tour.

10. Four Seasons Statue Garden

Take the time to enjoy the lovely garden areas and graceful marble statues representing *Spring, Summer, Fall and Winter*.
